Thank you for your enquiry about volunteering with the Weardale Railway.

The Weardale Railway is mainly run by volunteers whose contribution is essential to the running of the railway and its long term future.

You can be part of this by becoming a working member in one of our many departments. Generally you do not need specific experience as training will be provided in your chosen area.

We also have a thriving Junior Section for the younger members aged 10 to 15. Please see the website for full details www.wrjc.org.uk

Volunteering for Weardale Railway is a great way to get involved with your local community, make new friends and learn new skills. Whatever your age, whether you're male or female, if you have a couple of hours to spare or can make a more regular commitment, we need your help. Our normal age range is from 11 – 70 (but there is no upper age limit).

So what can I do?

We always have regular and one-off projects that we need help with, so whether you are working, at home, studying or looking to develop your career or skills, volunteering with Weardale Railway is a fantastic way to spend your time.

We currently have vacancies in the following areas:

Booking Office

Sell the tickets, answer the enquiries and generally meet the public also working behind the scenes in the station office, answering telephone enquiries and taking bookings.

There are vacancies at Stanhope and Wolsingham stations. A vital job!

Griddle Car Attendants

Our Griddle Car runs at various times throughout the year providing alcoholic drinks, tea, coffee, sandwiches etc. A chance to meet the public and ride the rails!

Café and Gift Shop Staff

The Gift Shop at Stanhope is always busy selling anything from postcards to books to children's railway toys whilst the Café is very well patronised. A significant part of the railway's income comes from these areas.

Working in the café will involve baking and cooking.

Depot

This area maintains and restores our coaches and locomotives.

For coach restoration skills in carpentry, metalworking, upholstery, plumbing, varnishing, painting, sign writing, trimming, wiring would all be of use but not essential as training is provided.

For locomotive maintenance, engineering experience is a distinct asset but painters and general helpers are every bit as much in demands as fitters, turners etc. Our permanent staff would welcome your support in this area. The work covers steam and diesel traction.

Gardening

If you have green fingers you would be welcome to join our team of gardeners looking after Stanhope and Wolsingham stations.

Guards

This role requires a period of training before being assessed to be a fully qualified Guard. The Guard, contrary to popular belief, is in charge of the train. The Driver thinks he is, but the Guard knows better!

Travelling Ticket Inspectors

Sell the tickets, answer the enquiries and generally meet the public. This role is very much the first point of contact for our customers when they travel with us. A good knowledge of the local area is essential.

Locomotive Drivers

Newcomers to the steam department will begin as Cleaners and progress to become Fireman and Drivers. To operate our diesels you will progress through being a Second Man and finally Driver.

Permanent Way

Out and about on the track itself. Fencing, ballasting, walking the line, checking the track, cutting back lineside growth, are all vital jobs. The work is fairly strenuous but can be tailored to suit your specific requirements.

Crossing Keeper

We currently have an operated level crossing at Broadwood where the keeper operates the warning lights and barriers keeping trains and road traffic safe. Other level crossings will open as we progress the railway toward Bishop Auckland and Eastgate. An ideal role for those that like working outside.

Promotion and Marketing

If you can help in this area you would be especially welcome. The railway is busy in the peak holiday months but is always seeking ways to fill seats 'out of season'. We are also looking to increase our exposure to the corporate market and the travel trade.

Station Staff

Platform duties consist of overseeing the safe and punctual departure of trains, answering queries from the passengers, and generally ensuring their safety. Some assistance is always useful to assist wheelchair bound passengers on and off the train and to escort them safely across the railway. Helping to keep the station tidy and assisting with special events are also important parts of the Station staffs' duties.

Other Vacancies

Vacancies exist for handymen, painters, etc. to do the general upkeep necessary to keep our stations looking neat and tidy.

Junior Club

Young people aged 10 to 15 can join the Weardale Railway Junior Club (WRjc) which offers members a training programme covering railway subjects, visits to other railways and from age 11, the opportunity to get involved in the day-to-day running of the railway under the supervision of experienced members of staff. Please don't let a perceived lack of skill deter you. Full on the job training is given as necessary. But the main thing is to come and enjoy yourself! In short, if you have the time and enthusiasm we can make use of you!

Potential volunteers must first become members of the Weardale Railway Trust for insurance purposes, a volunteer application form can then be submitted to the Volunteer Liaison Team. For your convenience, forms are attached. Further information can be obtained from the Volunteer Liaison Team by emailing weardale.railway@tiscali.co.uk

Once we have received your application form you will be invited along to Stanhope station for an induction session. Induction sessions normally take place at weekends giving you the opportunity to meet other volunteers working on the railway.

Please note that volunteers are required to apply for a Criminal Records Bureau check. CRB forms will be issued at your induction session and you will be required to submit these to us as part of the application process.
